I saw a great turnout the other night at the Dairy Queen when they celebrated old cars. I talked to the DJ and he said it is always so good to play old music and watch people look at cars and talk about the restoration of them. Talk about the places they drove those old cars, and now they come out of the garage for only special occasions.

I listened to a conversation about old toys today. The wind up tractors and the old tops, the jump ropes, and how excited people were when Tonka made trunks. So fun to see those old toys that remind us of so many play dates and the company that used to come to the house when kids were sent to play and adults played cards or talked about the latest going on in the neighborhood.

Memories are fun aren't they? It is good when we think of all those places we have been, all the people we have known, all the memories made. Do you think we miss out on today when we focus so much on the past?

I think of all the things that were planned for church in the old days, the programs, the Easter Sundays, the Christmas Eve services, the pancake breakfasts, the movie nights, the traditions.....the youth group meetings, the camping trips, the overnight sleep overs at church because we were raising money for hunger or some other need in the area.

What motivates us to bring the memories to fruition today? What did we learn from the "old days" that we can use today?

We have talked a lot about being the church in our everyday, ordinary lives. We have focused on being in community as a representative of Jesus. Are we missing the old memories so much we cannot find a way to celebrate Jesus today? The balance is challenging, but we certainly have a mission and a call, don't we? John Wesley talked a lot about being faith based people who shared Jesus in ways that made an impact on those in need. Social holiness. Sharing the Gospel in ways that make the lives better for our neighbors and each other. We are stepping out of our comfort zone some days, feeding people by packing meal bags and the blessing box. We shop for groceries, thinking of others who are hungry, not just ourselves. We are looking at a food event for 10,000. Who would have thought this would be our purpose today? We are buying beans and rice, perhaps not our usual purchases, but we are buying because we know this product is needed. We are people who are flexible, able to pivot with the needs of the times and the people. The absolute reality for each of us is that the times change. In most ways, we are willing to pivot too. We do not want to be left behind or miss out. Do we have that same zeal for church? Are we really being called to change or are we exploring our roots and living into our social holiness values? Are we embracing or resisting? It is always so good to have our belief systems challenged so we can see how we are really formed. What are the basic foundational values we rely on? Who is our rock and who is our guide in our daily life?

None of us like change, none of us are waiting to see what the next best idea is, but might we be missing the cracks where light is shining through? Might we be missing God's call and His beckoning? Could we delight in our past, bring it forward, and continue to live the life of a disciple, just as we have done for years.....stepping up, being bold, holding on to courage, relying on God to guide us.

John Wesley is known for words of challenge and encouragement......"Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." Kind of says it all, doesn't it?
