Thoughts from Kali . . .

Thoughts.....

Last night I received the text we have been waiting for. Chrisso's oldest sister, Dorothy passed away. She has been in hospice for a couple of weeks after her body just started to slow down and deteriorate. She had several mini strokes that required her daughter, Christine, to travel from Michigan to stay with her. Dorothy had moved to NC after she had fallen in her apartment in Worthington a couple of years ago. When Dorothy's son Mark moved to a new home recently, Dorothy transitioned to another assisted living. Dorothy had been active and independent, living in her own apartment in Worthington after living for years in Minneapolis. After her husband, Marv died, she wanted to get closer to her sisters who live in the Worthington area. Dorothy's kids have lived out of state for years. The journey of the human being varies depending on what is going on in life. We are rooted people who live a journey depending on our desires and depending on the circumstances and our own will. We all know the journey may take us to places we never even considered before. Dorothy continues on that journey of life.

This time of year always leads me to evaluate where I am and what my priorities are. The journey of a human being, once again. My new calendar has been purchased and I am entering dates for things already scheduled for 2026. I like to live in the day, enjoying today, and I also understand that things need to get scheduled. I do not want to miss out on today in the planning, so have been engaged in a new read and journal, entitled, "The Artistic Way". It is a book that centers on the creativity in each of us that gets stifled. There are things that are coming out in the writing....which is a dedicated 30 minutes each morning, leading me to some insights that are interesting. What holds me back from some of the places I feel called to go and be? When am I yielding

to "what others think" that keeps me from following the places I am called? What speaks to me and where is it I want to be in this life? The course is a several week opportunity to dive deeper. When I consider that I am in the last segment of my life, I want to live as intentionally as possible and I think this offers a good look. I am not desiring to live a life based on peer pressure or what makes everyone else satisfied when it comes to my integrity and God's call.

I assume everyone gets to the point of seeing what really matters. Sometimes, that is by choice and sometimes that is by other factors in life. Again, a piece of the journey.

All of this to say, where are you in your journey. More specifically, what is it you would like to see in church? I love the Thanksgiving Eve service, but have received lukewarm warm responses to the time and format, so I decided we will skip it this year. Part of the fun of it for me is being with a church family I love and give thanks for. It is important for me to be present in gratitude with the folks who I consider part of my well-being, each of you. So, I tell you this now and will again as I see you in November, perhaps at the Wrightstown Dinner on the 22nd. Christmas Eve services will soon be set. Advent hope will be part of the Sunday worship services. Some special Christmas Services are set for the individual churches based on your history and traditions. Things we can all participate in as we care to. Other things can certainly be added, just let me know what you are planning or interested in.

We have become a place for other services to offer things that will assist in the well being of others. Note the free flu clinic and the meals for our Haitian neighbors. I am surprised and excited to hear from the Catholic Church in Butler. A couple of months ago I was invited there to speak about the immigration problems for folks who have been encouraged to move here to work, and then have had a struggle with visas. They are hosting a soup supper to raise money for the Haitian project and they will be taking donations of winter wear for us as well. All of this is pretty great and overwhelming when one considers their hearts are totally softened by the status of people who live an hour away from them. Amazing! The issues that we are experiencing in our lives were not on my primary agenda, the journey has shifted.

Where is your journey taking you? All of our churches have ebbed and flowed with attendance, but the fact remains, since the pandemic, attendance has not ever resumed to what it was. I am not saying it is a piece of the pandemic because I have seen the attendance at sporting events, parties, receptions, fund raisers be pretty full. I have heard the same excitement in a vacation or family event that I heard prior to the shut down. So, just wondering where the journey is for you? We are quick to say family commitments have changed for the young families, sports are scheduled for Saturday and Sunday....part of the journey. Facebook and YouTube Tube church have taken up some of the space, part of the journey. Neither Facebook or YouTube puts us in touch with who is in need, who needs prayer, who benefits from a hug or a handshake. None of it allows the person watching at home to be refreshed from the well spring of fellowship.

Part of my journey has been because someone intentionally saw a space in me that could be filled or encouraged because of their intention.....just like the intention of hospice, the intention of soup for a cause, the intention of gifting an Aunt the Artistic Way because you could see in her a need to find the core of purpose. Life at church is on a journey.....I am encouraged and inspired by the people who share their decoration ideas and hearts....because I can't get to five churches to do what will make worship more intentional. I am encouraged by people who think we all care and are people of love, seeing the best in us. I am encouraged by people who say yes to what will actually make a difference, not just exist. I am encouraged by the folks who want their church to stay meaningful, offering a beacon of life to a hurting world and actually show up to be part of the light. Life, the journey is filled with so many emotions, actions, intentions. It is in this vein that I speak of my gratitude in the "Artistic Way". it is in the journey that I see your gifts, the hurts of a broken world, the hope of a Friend who never forsakes us, but spurred us on because He saw in others a life worth living. He spoke love and truth into their journey as they showed up in His.

Glad to be on the journey with you.....looking forward to sharing your journey pieces that will form what goes on in the life of our churches. Wishes for a month of gratitude, a time to pause, a time to act, a time to

reflect, a time to live. A time for life. Saw this post the other day....and want to share it with you.

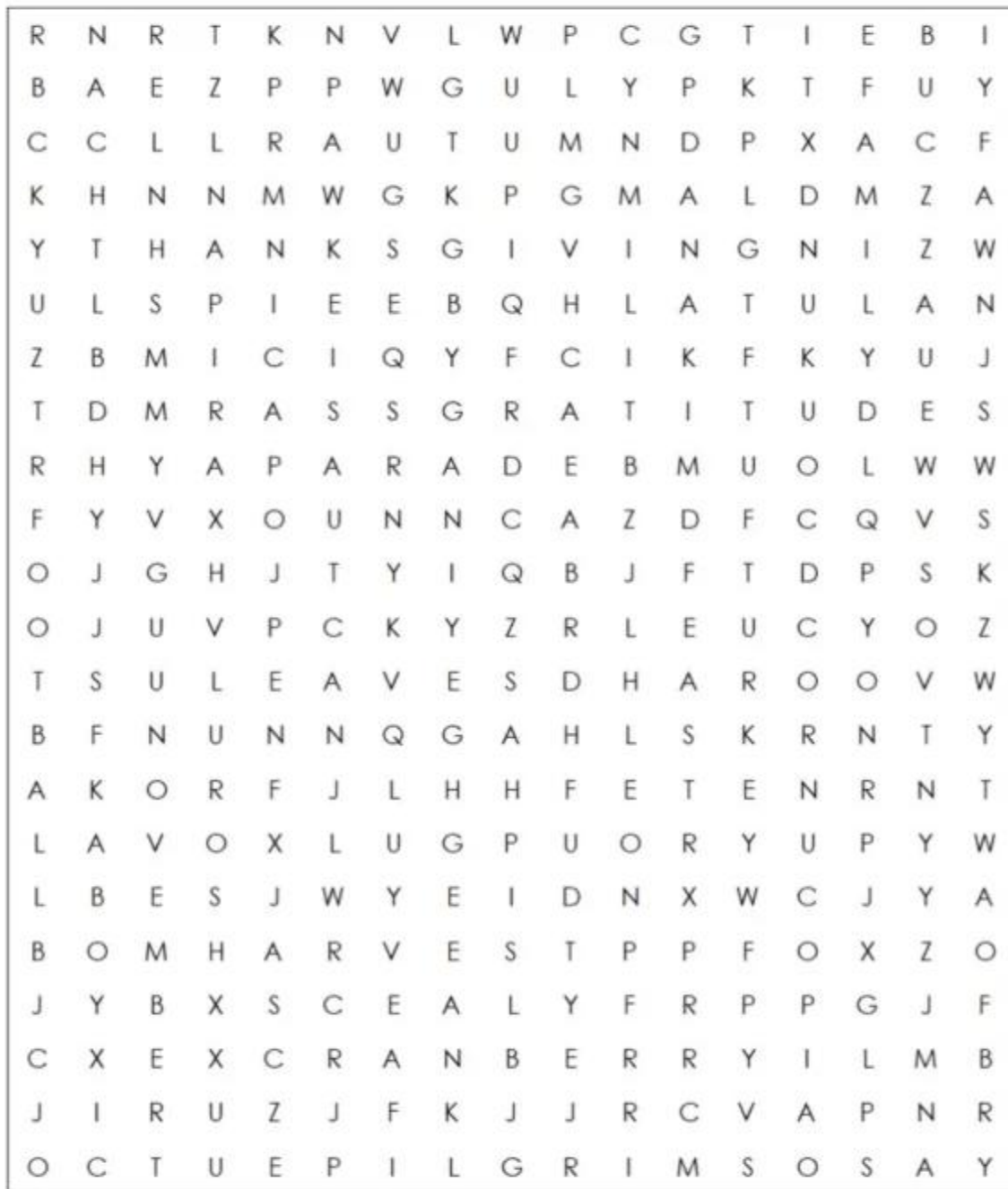
