Thoughts from Kali ...

A certified lay servant is a person who has taken the Connexion class. It may open the doors for a person to serve as staff or a volunteer in a specialized ministry. It may also lead you down a path where you know yourself better than you did before. It involves taking an online course by yourself or with a group. Each person completes an asset inventory which highlights your gifts and may help you discern what you want to do with those gifts, in church or in the community. So often we do not look at our gifts and assets in life. We go through the process of saying yes or no to an opportunity. So often, the no comes easiest and perhaps, we don't get to participate in something that would bring value and meaning to our life. It may also bring value and meaning to the life of others. Kind of seems like that would be what a Jesus follower would be looking to do. The Connexion class costs 25 dollars and our church would pay for the class. This information would make an impact on our churches and would enhance personal development. So, if you are interested, please be in touch. This could be a life changer!!!!

My Course of Study class this fall is on evangelism. It is interesting and challenging. What do you think of when you think of evangelism? Many of us have a negative connotation, but it really has to do with everyday living and offering Jesus in our daily lives. We become involved in a faith formation, becoming baptized and often, confirmed to add value to our lives and to add value to the lives of others. It is life changing and hope filled as we grow in love and care of one another. The more you know about your Jesus connection, the more you rely on him and grow in him. We all are in the need of connection and growth, sometimes more than others.

Evangelism offers us to be in connection, growing together. We have been in ministry together for years in one way or another, through sharing ministries and relationships. The decision of Wrightstown UMC to join the rest of us is a wonderful thought and reality to plan for. We need to firm up some thoughts and schedules; however, there are some very exciting opportunities to look at. The Cabinet will get back to us as they plan for the change in connection. Hopefully, we will make plans accordingly, holding an open mind and heart. Two of the schedules that have been lifted up would allow me to get to all churches two times a month which would provide for some consistency that I would appreciate. There may be a couple options to look at financially, and it would be fun to look at the options openly, actually seeing what may be the best option. At any rate,

I am excited about the opportunities for all of us. The more assets and gifts, the more input, the more we can share resources, the more we can celebrate our mission and ministries! Again, a good reason to explore your personal passions and how you can bring them to fruition in the light of ministry and evangelism.

In looking to a new year of ministry, the church conferences have been set. Our cluster is at Alexandria on the date of the bazaars in Eagle Bend and Long Prairie, just like last year. This is less than ideal for us, but if we can get two people from each church to attend, we can cover the basic actions needed. Each church or the cluster of churches can then affirm the rosters at our churches in November and December. We are expected to be in Alex at 10 a.m. on November 1st. If you can let me know who can go, that would be great. Hopefully, more than two from each of the churches not hosting a bazaar that day can attend. The pastoral compensation form is due by December 1st, so that will have to be submitted. Evangelism entails the grueling work of the church, the ministry, the mission, and the day-to-day connection. As we studied the materials for this class, it was easy to see the places you are stepping up in sharing the love of Jesus with each other.

We have all experienced hurt and pain, victory and loss, and it is in the fellowship that we can come together and grow through the difficulties. On Wednesday during conversations, I read from the book, "God Didn't Make Us To Hate Us". By Reverend Lizzie McManus-Dail. In this particular devotion, Reverend McManus-Dail said that hard things happen in life. We err and cause harm and others cause us harm. That is why the body of believers matters. We lift each other up and hold each other accountable and we extend and receive mercy. Doing something bad does not mean that we are beyond redeeming and mercy does not mean co-signing on what was done to us. Forgiveness inherently recognizes that what happened was not okay, because the act of forgiving inherently acknowledges that something bad has happened. We do not forgive good things, We do not forgive people who have done us no harm. To forgive, to choose the brutal path of mercy, is to say: I am choosing more...more life, more freedom, more possibility...even in the face of something or someone who wanted to steal my freedom, steal my possibilities, and possibly even end my life. This is why mercy comes from God. Mercy is an act of imagination. It imagines there can be so much more...more color, more forgiveness, more joy, more time together...we can be more than the worst things we have ever done and we can be more than the worst things done to us. Mercy is a language of God's imagination for what we can be, all of us, together. That is GOOD NEWS! Looking forward to conversation, plans, hopes, dreams, and a big dose of imagination! God's blessing as we dream together! Amen

The Ministerial Fund was gifted 500 dollars this month and we are grateful. The expenses have been great with folks struggling with cancer and making ends meet, electric shut offs, and medical

visits. Our burger is about gone and we have had requests for food help. The requests are all looked at in line with all resources in our area. The other resources are pretty dried up. Our total in the account includes about 2500 dollars earmarked for immigration and needs related to displacement, homeless needs, food needs, etc. We have been contacted by many people outside of our county wanting to be available to assist with those who are coming from violent areas and hired here to work. The status of visas and work permits is always in flux with federal mandates changing and putting workers at risk of not having employment. We are grateful for all who have assisted in both areas of need. Our neighbors often include those in our own circles who ran into a hard time. Thanks for your love and generosity, the ways you always show up.
